

What does it mean to be a Title I School?

- Being a Title I school means receiving federal funding (Title I dollars) to supplement the school's existing programs. These dollars are used for:
 - Identifying students experiencing academic difficulties and providing timely assistance to help these student's meet the State's challenging content standards
 - Purchasing supplemental staff/programs/materials/supplies
 - Conducting parent and family engagement meetings/trainings/activities

What does Brookfield Elementary do for students who need assistance?

Tutoring

Students are provided extended learning opportunities (tutoring and assistance) after school

Intervention

All students participate in an intervention block (Paw Pride) during the school day. In addition, Title I teachers work with small groups each day on targeted skills in reading

Resources

Title I funds are used to provide supplemental instructional resources and materials to support learners


Schoolwide Program

What is our Title I program?

- Brookfield Elementary uses Title I funds, along with other Federal, State, and local funds to operate a “schoolwide program”.
- Schoolwide means that ALL students are eligible to receive services and support.
- The law states that we must focus on those students who are “at-risk” or “most at-risk” of not passing the state assessment.

Parents' Right-to-Know

- Whether your student's teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade level and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction
- Whether your student's teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria has been waived
- Whether your student's teacher is teaching in the field of discipline of the certification of the teacher
- Whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications



Parents' Right-to-Know

- Information on the level of achievement and academic growth of your student, if applicable and available, on each of the State academic assessments required under Title I.A. (MAP results, STAR reading and math benchmark results)
- Timely notice that your student has been assigned, or has been taught for 4 or more consecutive weeks by, a teacher who has not met applicable State certification or licensure requirements at the grade level and subject area in which the teacher has been assigned.
